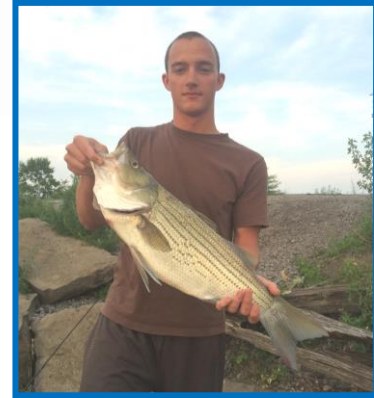

The Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission's Lake Habitat Section has a seasonal Fisheries Biologist Aide (FBA) opportunity that might be right for you. As an FBA you will get an inside look at the conservation efforts being conducted by the PFBC during fish habitat projects on the lakes and streams of Pennsylvania. You will have a chance to go on the road with Habitat Management staff to complete fish habitat improvement projects all over the Commonwealth and receive great hands-on experience implementing conservation projects.

Pay Rate: \$13.23/hour.

Start Date: April 9, 2018 (Graduates) OR May 7, 2018 (Graduating Seniors)

Term: April or May – October 2018, February – October 2019, February – October 2020

Work Location: 595 East Rolling Ridge Drive, Bellefonte, PA 16823

Work Schedule: Monday – Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Overtime and occasional Saturday hours expected.

Travel: Some overnights required throughout field season. You will receive reimbursement for your expenditures on food and hotel stays.
