## PENNSYLVANIA WATER FACTS - (Appendix D)

Compared to other states, Pennsylvania is a relatively "water-rich" state.

**Pennsylvania wetlands** cover about 404,000 acres (1.4% of the state). Nearly half of these wetlands occur in the northeast and northwest corners of the state.

97% of the wetlands are dominated by vegetation.

2% of the wetlands are associated with lakes.

1% of the wetlands is associated with rivers and streams.

#### **Water Sources**

Pennsylvania's **surface water** includes 65,000 miles of streams and more than 2,400 lakes, reservoirs, and ponds.

Approximately 47 trillion gallons of **ground water** lie in the soil and rock of our state.

There are over a million wells in Pennsylvania.

In Pennsylvania, 41% of the population gets its water from ground water sources.

In 1995, the total **withdrawal** of surface and ground water in Pennsylvania was about 9.68 billion gallons per day.

In an average year, 42 inches of **precipitation** fall to replenish water supplies.
