## Announcing the 2013 Private Forest Landowners Conference: The Future of Penn's Woods

Last issue we announced the creation of the new Center for Private Forests at Penn State. Now we're pleased to announce the statewide private forest landowners conference, scheduled for May 3 and 4, 2013, at the Blair County Convention Center,

Altoona, PA. This day and a half conference will have presentation tracts, keynote addresses, informational and resource displays, a silent auction, good food, and lots of private forest landowners from and with whom to learn more about caring for our parts of Penn's Woods.

The conference is in the active planning stages. We'll soon be looking for sponsors and funders, presentation tract ideas, speakers, etc. We're hoping to attract between 600 and 1000 private forest landowners and stakeholders to take part in this event.
