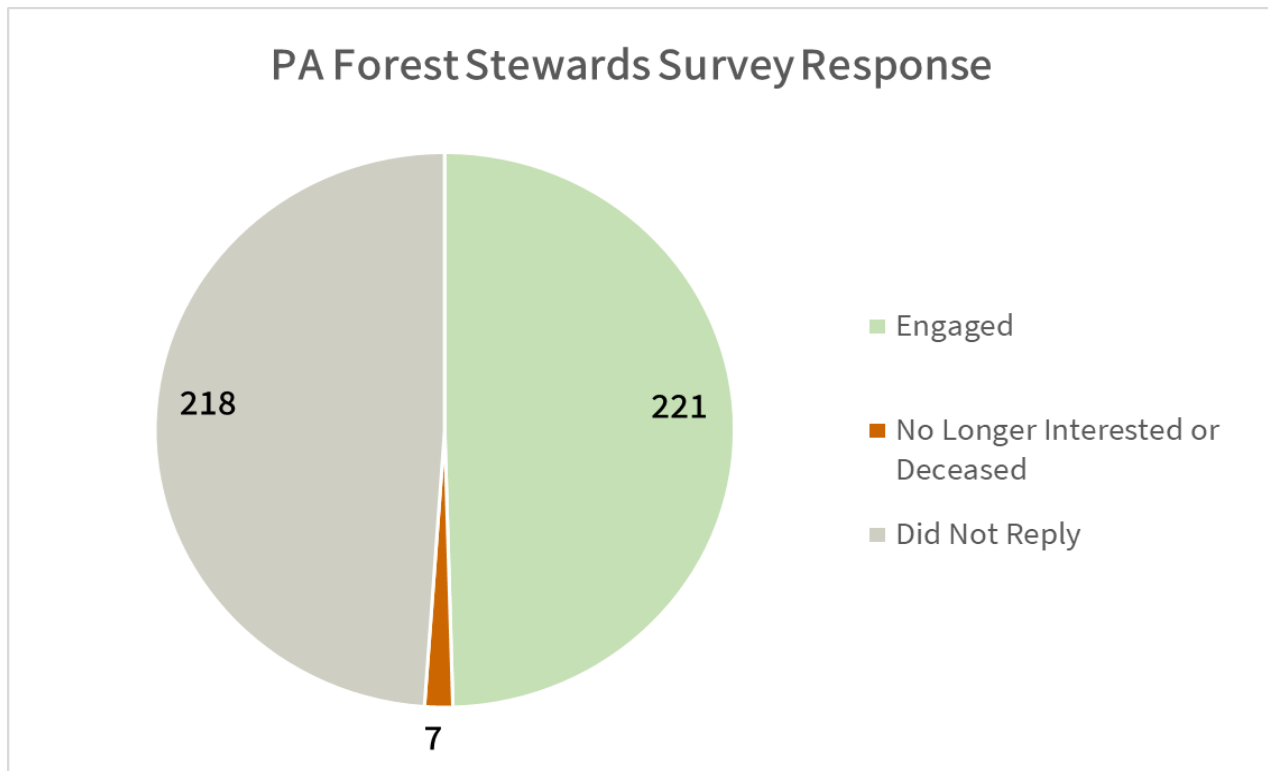


# Pennsylvania Forest Stewards Summary Report of 2021



*The 2021 edition of the Pennsylvania Forest Stewards biennial survey shows PA Stewards volunteers continue to actively promote forest stewardship in their communities.*

Of the 446 PA forest stewards surveyed, 233 provided survey information (52% response rate). Separate surveys were sent to each PA Forest Steward within a household.



## Number of Outreach Hours Volunteered

Using the national volunteer time average of \$28.54 per hour, this outreach totals \$444,625 in volunteer time.

PA Forest Stewards were asked to estimate how many friends, neighbors, or members of the public they reached through their stewardship-related outreach activities. According to respondents, they reached 435,418 people within the last year.

To ease reporting, we broke outreach activities into nine categories, through which volunteers could report time and people reached. The most time (almost 3,800 hours) was spent conducting outreach through the media, which resulted in the most people reached (almost 400,000).

We also asked about time spent practicing good forest management on properties. Respondents spent 32,579 hours working on their own and some public properties. This equates to more than 15 full-time employees at 40 hours per week for 50 weeks working on properties across the state.
