

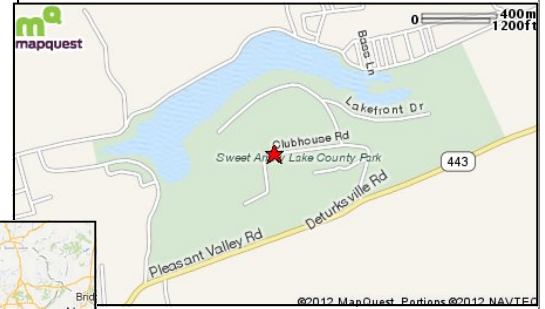


FOREST: Forest Restoration Specialist Training



Forest Restoration Specialist Training (FOREST) This will be a one-day condensed version of our four-day training. Training will focus on establishing and maintaining high value hardwood species on degraded lands, such as strip mines. Participants will gain skills and knowledge applicable for many aspects of sustainable forestry management, far beyond a single species.

Outdoors: Site selection, forest mensuration and monitoring of forest plantings
