Forest Restoration Specialist Training



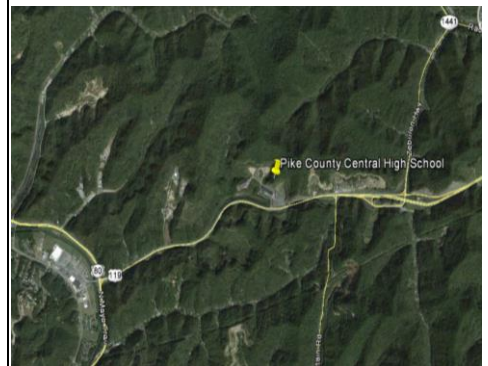
Forest Restoration Specialist Training (FOREST)
